Robert M. Kaplan has served as Chief Science Officer at the US Agency for Health Care Research and Quality (AHRQ) and Associate Director of the National Institutes of Health,

where he led the behavioral and social sciences programs. He is also a Distinguished Research Professor of Health Services and Medicine at UCLA, where he previously led the UCLA/RAND AHRQ health services training program and the UCLA/RAND CDC Prevention Research Center. He was Chair of the Department of Health Services from 2004 to 2009. From 1997 to 2004 he was Professor and Chair of the Department of Family and Preventive Medicine, at the University of California, San Diego. He is a past President of five different national or international professional organizations and has served as Editor-In-Chief for two academic journals. His 20 books and over 565 articles or chapters have been cited more than 58,000 times (H-index>108). Google scholar includes him in the list of the most highly cited authors in science. Kaplan was elected to the National Academy of Medicine (formerly the Institute of Medicine) in 2005. He is currently a faculty member at the Stanford School of Medicine Clinical Excellence Research Center (CERC). Additionally, Dr. Kaplan co-founded the Right Care Initiative Technical Expert Group.
